Daughter finds mother

MIAMI AP - Judith Rosen surrendered her infant daughter to a New York adoption agency in 1946, then fought guilt and sadness for 31 years. Then on the day after Thanksgiving this year, long after she gave up her search in the face of official indifference and silence, came a voice on the telephone: Mother. 
