# Restorers ready to fly antique aircraft

Cooper, 45, his partner in the project, also lives in Reynoldsburg and is a tractor-trailer driver. Moore is a certified flight instructor and Cooper a student pilot.

Their plane, a Waco EGC-7 built by the Waco Aircraft Co., Troy, Ohio, sold for \$11,125 in 1930. Moore says only two of the models still exist, and theirs is only one flyable.

Moore says he searched all over the nation to acquire parts for the plane's Wright-Whirlwind engine, which was built in the 1930s. The engine develops 100-horsepower. They have restored it to its

original blue, trimmed in red and gold. It is 32 feet long, has a 28-foot wingspan, cruises at 150 mph and has a maximum speed of 218 mph.

The plane consumes 17.5 gallons of gasoline an hour and can stay aloft for four hours, traveling from 600 to 650 miles.

They plan to exhibit their prize at air shows.
