Lincoln woman dies in wreck

Twenty-seven-year old Pamela S. Vincent, 804 Short 11th, was killed at 9:35 p.m. Wednesday on I-55 near St. Mary's, Mo. in Ste. Genevieve County. Missouri Highway Patrol said the car she was driving skidded on a slick overpass, she lost control and ran off the interstate, down an embankment and overturned.

Missouri Highway Patrol said the accident occurred on I-55, one and one half miles south of the interchange of highway M and N. Ms. Vincent was southbound on the interstate and received fatal injuries. She was taken to Ste. Genevieve County Hospital and pronounced dead at 10:33 p.m. "CPR was administered for a short period of time, but was not effective," police authorities said.

A passenger in the Vincent car, Thomas P. Lucas, 26, 1828 Second St., received injuries to left shoulder and was taken to Ste. Genevieve County Hospital, according to the Highway Patrol. Hospital authorities said Lucas was treated and released.

Ste. Genevieve County Coroner Adrian Bailor said, "Ms. Vincent was dead on arrival at the hospital with head and chest injuries." Funeral arrangements are still pending according to Coroner Bailor.
