Dozens of students have volunteered for juries in the month-old program and those who have served are asking for more duty, according to Zarise Steinberg, a counselor for juvenile offenders and organizer of the program.

Asked why he was serving on the volunteer panel, one juror said, "Why do adults serve on juries? It's our duty, isn't it?"

Prosecutors choose which cases are to be decided by the youth jury. Violent crimes or "anything too serious" goes to Juvenile Court, said District Attorney Dale Tuskay.

Accused youths must admit they are guilty. Otherwise their cases go to Juvenile Court. They also must agree to accept the "contract" decided upon by jurors.

Thursday's session was typical of how the program works.

At one end of a courtroom table was a four-boy, three-girl panel. At the other end was 14-year-old Tommy (not his real name,) accused of shoplifting \$2.40 worth of gum and cigarettes.

Twice before Tommy had been caught shoplifting. He was sent home each time after being lectured by police.

Jurors listened as Tommy's father talked of shame and bewilderment at his son's actions. He said Tommy was reacting to peer pressure about his below average height and added that it didn't help that the family was Mexican-American.

During deliberations, jurors asked Mrs. Steinberg how they could tell the father to stop talking about his son's height and give him more positive reinforcement. She told them to just say it and they did.

Mount Pulaski man killed in accident

A 47-year-old Mount Pulaski man was killed Saturday, his wife and two other persons injured, in a two-car head-on collision on Route 121 seven miles south of Lincoln.

Logan County Deputies assisted the state police at the scene. John H. Swearingen, Deputy Logan County Coroner, conducted the preliminary information in-

vestigation for the coroner's office.

Naylor's body was taken to to Frick Memorial Home, Mount Pulaski. The funeral will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday with Al Marshland officiating. Burial will be at the Mount Pulaski Cemetery. Visitation will be from 5 to 8 p.m. Tuesday.

He was born April 12, 1932, in Elletts, Ky., the son of John and Denny Naylor. He married Jean VanDevender July 10, 1953 in Elletts, Ky.

Surviving are his wife, a son Franklin Jr., Mount Pulaski; four daughters, Melody Leesman, Hartsburg, and Beverly, Tracey, and Penny Naylor, all of Mount Pulaski; five brothers, Neal, Elwood, Eitel and Melvin, all of Kentucky and J.
