# Erosion costly

URBANA, Ill. (AP) - Illinois loses 199 million tons of soil each year due to erosion from rain and floods, a new government study shows, and that costs the state at least \$12 million a year.

"At least one-third of the land owners are doing an adequate job of preventing soil erosion," said Warren Fitzgerald of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service.

However, he said about two-thirds of Illinois farm land still needs some type of soil erosion control.

"The land in Illinois is too valuable to let it erode away," said Fitzgerald.

He said that the national average for soil loss due to water erosion is about five tons per acre each year — two tons less than the Illinois average.

About \$6 million a year in federal funds are now available to farmers in Illinois who want to begin some type of soil conservation practice, officials said, but that is about half the amount needed to meet the current demand.

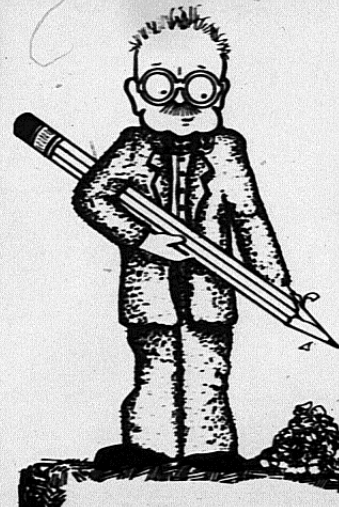
