**CLINTON** — The bodies of two DeWitt men were recovered Monday from a new lake at the Illinois Power Company facility at Clinton. Both men drowned after their canoe capsized late Sunday night, authorities said.

The dead were identified as Ricky Austin, 23, and his brother-in-law, Donald Winstead, 16. A third man, Galen Reeder, also of DeWitt, was able to swim to safety.

Members of the Lincoln-Logan underwater Rescue and Recovery Team assisted in recovering the body of the 16-year-old youth, according to Bill Bradley of the Lincoln-Logan County Emergency Services and Disaster Agency. "The team was called at 3:10 a.m. Monday by the DeWitt County Sheriff to assist in locating the two drowning victim," said Bradley.

"The body of Austin was recovered prior to the arrival of the Lincoln underwater team. "The second body was recovered at approximately 5:05 a.m."
