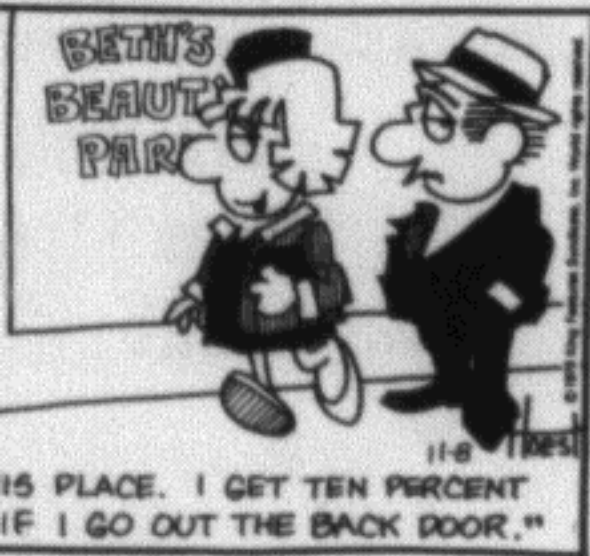

Hunting accident claims life of 15 year old boy

MOUNT PULASKI — A hunting accident late Sunday afternoon resulted in the death of a 15-year-old Mount Pulaski boy. According to Logan County authorities, Scott Leesman, 15, was killed when a .410 shotgun discharged accidentally.

Logan Deputies said at the time of the accident, Leesman and a friend, Frank Van Fossen, 15, were hunting on the farm of Leesman's grandfather, Eugene Weckel, located approximately one half mile from Route 54 and the Illiopolis blacktop.

The two youths were hunting and walked around a machine shed where they stopped to rest when the shotgun Van Fossen place across his lap discharged, authorities said. Leesman received a wound in his chest and was transported by Lincoln-Logan paramedics to ALM

Hospital. According to Logan County Coroner Edward Barry, Leesman was dead on arrival.

Authorities said the gun apparently had a "hair trigger" and discharged accidentally, killing Leesman. Barry said, "A coronor's inquest will be held at a later date." The accident occurred at 4:52 p.m. Sunday, according to Logan County Sheriff's Deputies.

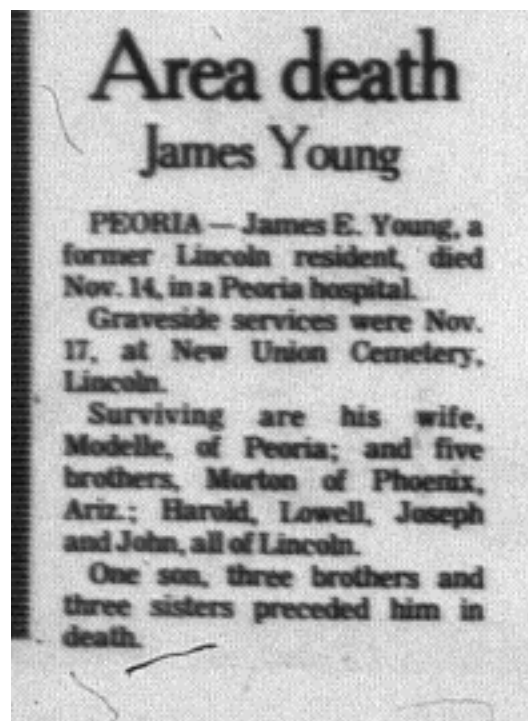
