She was a member of the choir and women's fellowship of Danville United Church of Christ.

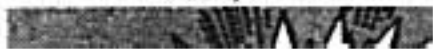

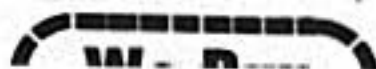
