Early tax bill be estimated

The time is fast approaching when owners of property in Logan County will be receiving those dreaded real estate tax bills. Historically taxes have been due without penalty, June 1 and Sept. 1. However, for various reasons it has been impossible the past few years to get tax bills out on time. Because of this, the Illinois Legislature enacted a law giving counties the authority to send out statements estimating the first installment. This estimate can be based on the previous years taxes.

Since late collections have put nany taxing districts in financial bind, making it necessary to borrow to carry on their services, a resolution was passed by the Logan County Board authorizing the County Collector to issue tax statements on this accelerated basis.


