### John Gleason

SAN BERNADINO, Cal. — One person has been arrested in the murder of a 30-year old Marine Corps lance corporal. Cpl. John R. Gleason, son of John and Florence Gleason, formerly of Lincoln, was discovered Feb. 3 in a ditch near San Bernadino, approximately three hours after he had been fatally shot in the head.

Corporal Gleason's body lay unidentified in a morgue for nearly three weeks before his body was identified. His parents, John and Florence Gleason, of Royal Oaks, Calif., do not know why it took three weeks to identify the body.

San Bernadino County Sheriff's Deputies have arrested one man, with other arrests expected to follow. Police arrested a California man last month in connection with Gleason's murder. The family believes Gleason was a robbery victim because his wallet was missing when his body was found.

Services and burial were in Royal Oak, Mich.

Gleason graduated from Royal Oak's Shrine High School in 1977 and joined the Marine Corps the following September. He had been stationed in Japan and Iran and was to return to the Middle East this month for duty aboard an aircraft carrier.

Corporal Gleason's uncle is Bill Hardin, of Atlanta.

Since late collections have put many taxing districts in a financial bind, making it necessary to borrow to carry on their services, a resolution was passed by the Logan County Board authorizing the County Collector to issue tax statements on this accelerated basis.

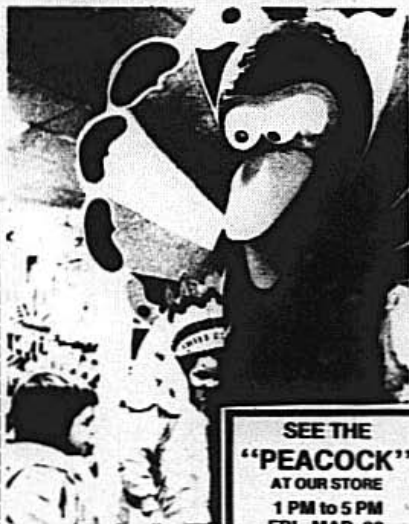
