Conner said officials don't know yet how wide an area might be infested.

Meanwhile, California authorities worried that a growing infestation would force quarantine of a fourth agriculturerich county.

Florida officials, concerned about the state's \$4 billion-ayear produce industry — particularly the lucrative citrus groves that start just miles from where the flies were found — charged that County officials planned to meet today, the first day of the apple harvest, to discuss the discovery of an egg-laden fruit fly outside the three-county quarantine zone.

The fly was found Saturday 30 miles southwest of the zone where officials thought they had contained the pest, which deposits its eggs under the skin of many fruit and vegetables.

Crews were set to begin a fourth round of aerial spraying today over a 267-square-mile area, which was to be expanded later this week 179 square miles deeper into Santa Clara County. Thursday at the Methodist Church in Clarkfield, of which she was a member. Burial will be in Clarkfield Cemetery.




