WASHINGTON — Here's how area members recorded on major roll call votes in the final Session of the 97th Congress.

HOUSE
DEFENSE By a vote of 334 for and 84 against, the House approved a bill appropriating \$199.7 billion for FY 1982. Among major outlays, the bill provides for procurement, \$61.9 billion for operations, \$38.1 billion for personnel, \$19.9 billion for development, and \$14.8 billion for military money for Administration priorities such as MX missile, Stealth bomber, and a beefed-up MX missile. The bill (HR 4995) later was cleared and sent to the President.

The bill, the most expensive single appropriation enacted, fell less than \$1 billion short of the budget request. Its price tag is \$28 billion less than the defense bill. The bill (HR 4995) later was cleared and sent to the President.

Supporter Joseph Addabbo, D-N.Y., called it a possible solution that reasonable men have under extremely trying circumstances.

Opponent Bruce Vento, D-Minn., said it is security is highly expensive, "the interest also requires a strong economy which cannot waste in defense spending."

Reps. Harold Washington, D-1, Gus Russo, D-3, Cardiss Collins, D-7, and Sidney "Ray" Rothman, D-11, voted "nay."

BLACK LUNG The House passed, 363 for and 100 against, a bill to restore solvency to the trust fund that pays miners stricken with black lung disease. It doubles the excise tax on extracted coal source of revenue. Also, it tightens criteria for the trust fund and it gives the trust fund responsibility for the cost of medical care for miners.

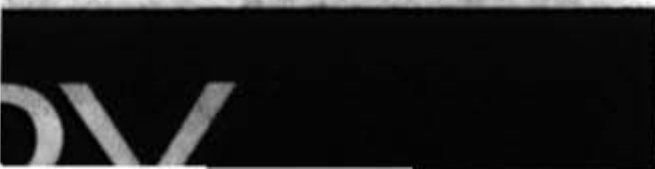

—Whether you file the long or short form, you may subtract half the money given political candidates; the maximum credit is \$50 for a single return and \$100 for a joint return.

—If you earned less than \$10,000 and there is a dependent child at home, you may qualify for the earned-income credit of up to \$800. This can be paid even if you have no tax liability. Check the instructions to see if you qualify.

—A credit is allowed for 20 percent of certain expenses involved in caring for a child or handicapped dependent. The maximum credit is \$400 if one child is involved; \$800 if there are two or more. Use Form 2441.

—If you installed storm windows, insulation or certain other weatherproofing devices in your principal home last year, you may qualify for a credit of up to \$300. There is a separate credit of up to \$4,000 for home installation of certain solar- or wind-powered energy equipment. See Form 5696 and IRS Publication 903.
