"I went in and asked Clara if she knew her house was on fire," Ms. Batterton said. Ms. Jackson then sent her cousin to call the

fire department.

Ms. Jackson, her son Charles, Ms. Batterton and some other relatives all share the residence, which is owned by Paul Kelly of Lincoln. The family moved into the house May 3.

Fire Chief Everett Kennett said he carried two parakeets out of the burning house when they began to suffer from breathing the smoke-filled air.

There was no fire in the interior of the house, although there was some smoke and water damage to the rooms of the home, Kennett said. Sparks described damage to the house as moderate, noting that a portion of the roof will need to be replaced.

A few firefighters remained at the scene to watch for hot spots Thursday afternoon.

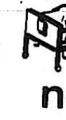
