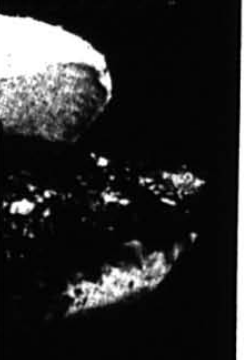

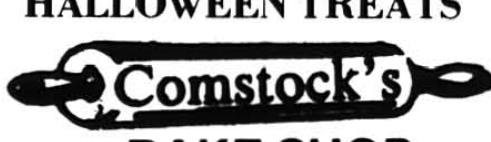

Federal mediator John Canestraight, in St. Louis, said Thursday he called for the talks, to be held at a Bridgeton, Mo., hotel, because neither side had made arrangements to meet since the strike started Oct. 1.

Spokesmen for both Caterpillar and the UAW had expressed willingness in the last week to resume negotiations on a three-year pact to replace the one which expired at midnight Sept. 30.

The Oct. 27 session will mark the first time a federal mediator has entered the negotiations in an effort to settle the deadlock.

Meanwhile, Caterpillar today announced the temporary layoffs of another 635 salaried employees nationwide effective Monday, Oct. 18.
