Researchers make link between gene, high blood pressure

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

NEW YORK — The first human study to link a gene to the most common kind of blood pressure is a major advance that could eventually help in treatment and prevention, scientists say.

The gene was implicated by

several lines of statistical evidence in two groups of siblings with high blood pressure and unrelated people without the condition.

The study dealt with "essential" hypertension, which affects more than 50 million Americans and accounts for

about 95 percent of all high blood pressure. Scientists believe that multiple genes and environmental factors play a role in the disease, which can lead to heart attacks and strokes.

Scientists said the study is the first in humans to link essential hypertension to a gene directly.

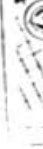
