She also was preceded in death by one brother and one sister.

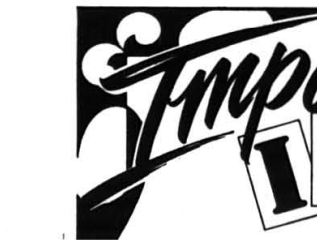
