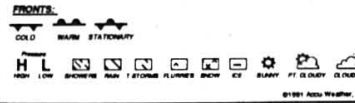
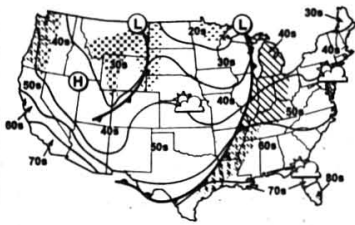

Coach who staged shooting won't quit his job

LIBERTYVILLE — A high school football coach who says he staged a fake shooting to motivate his players now says he will not resign from his job.

Coach Dale Christensen had promised to put his resignation from Libertyville High School in writing by Wednesday. But the veteran football coach instead told the district superintendent he wanted to stay.

The district's superintendent, Donald Gossett, said that the

coach renounced the stunt, but told him he had changed his mind about leaving his job. Gossett said he would move to have Christensen fired.

On Nov. 20, hours before his team played Loyola Academy in a state semifinal playoff game, Christensen addressed team members at a pep talk in the school's cafeteria.

During the talk, Christensen interceded in a fake fight he had orchestrated between two youths. Shots rang out from

what later was determined to be a starter pistol and Christensen fell to the ground as phony blood spread across his shirt.

Panicked students scrambled for cover or fled the school cafeteria. At least two calls were placed to police, who sped to the scene.

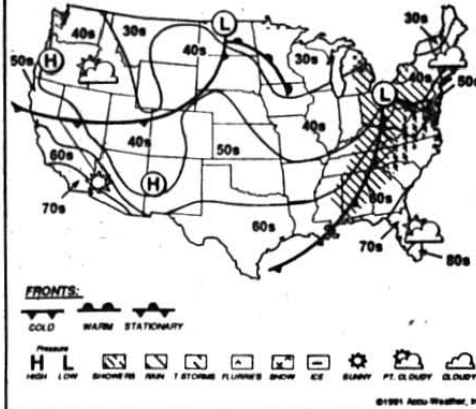

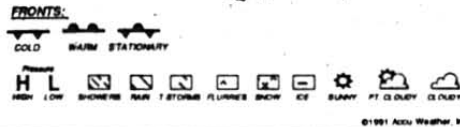
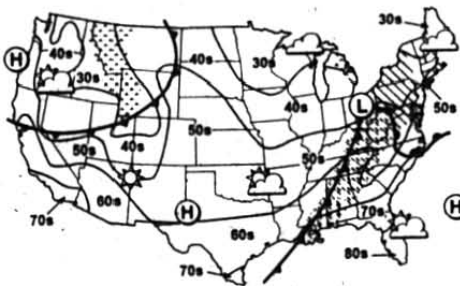

"We support the United Farm Workers union and we are concerned for the health and safety of students on campus. ... We believe that the University of Illinois should be an environmentally and socially just institution," the association said.

The union and California table-grape growers have fought for years over pesticides and

collective bargaining.

United Farm Workers does not have labor contracts with the industry.

A spokesman for a coalition of California growers said the industry was not allowed to tell its side of the story to the university.

"We contacted the food service department. They said it was too late," said spokesman Adan Ortega. "There's never been an open forum."

The police search was to resume today, but Chief Battelle said the outlook was not good.

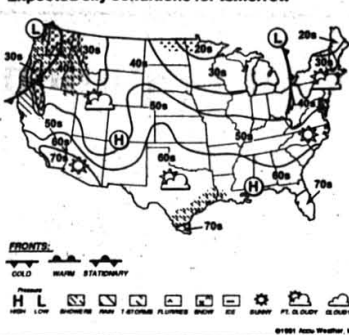

Board of Trade

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain and soybean futures prices were mostly higher in early trading today on the Chicago Board of Trade on signs of stronger export demand for U.S. corn and soybeans.

A weekly Agriculture Department report late Monday showed that the USDA inspected more corn and beans for export last week than traders expected. Corn and soybeans ended mostly higher Monday.

Wheat futures were narrowly mixed in early trading after three days of strong gains. Buying interest was tempered by an Australian forecast for the largest Australian wheat harvest in nine years.

Wheat for December delivery was unchanged at \$3.67 a bushel; December corn was 1 1/2 cents higher at \$2.96 1/4 a bushel; December oats were 1 1/4 cents higher at \$1.33 1/4 a bushel; January soybeans were up 1 cent at \$6.80 1/4 a bushel.

Livestock and meat futures were mostly lower in early trading on the Chicago Mercan-tile Exchange, erasing much of the gains posted in most contracts on Monday.

Live cattle for December delivery were down 45 cent at 71.60 cents a pound; January feeder cattle were 42 cent lower at 82.15 cents a pound; December live hogs were unchanged at 44.22 cents a pound; February frozen pork bellies were down 35 cent at 51.80 cents a pound.

Wall Street at noon

NEW YORK (AP) — Stock prices were mixed at midday, with little to inspire investors.

At noon on Wall Street, the Dow Jones

Volume on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange was 129.81 million shares, com-pared with 122.28 million at the same time in the previous session.

Declining shares narrowly outnumbered ad-vances on the NYSE, with 908 up, 948 down and 727 unchanged.

The NYSE composite index was down 0.28 at 257.37. On the American Stock Exchange, the market value index was up 0.38 at 466.20, while the Nasdaq composite index was down 2.20 at 768.69.

There was little to motivate investors in either direction, analysts said.

"It's a quiet day. There's nothing going on," said David Shulman, chief market strategist at Salomon Brothers.

Still, bond prices, which led Monday's mod-est blue-chip advance, were lower this morn-ing, pushing up interest rates. That makes stock investors worry about the higher cost of money to corporations and the relative at-tractiveness of shares.
Bonds were being pushed higher in part by a jump in crude oil prices.

Beer giant brewing up deal to build in China

ST. LOUIS — Anheuser-Busch Cos. Inc. is close to an agreement to build a brewery in eastern China.

The brewery giant bought a 5 percent stake in China's largest brewery, Tsingtao Brewery Co., in June. Busch and Tsingtao are planning joint construction of the new brewery.

Busch chairman August A. Busch III said the company team sent to negotiate the construction deal with Tsingtao returned from China last week. He told the St. Louis Post-Dispatch that the new brewery would be near Tsingtao's headquarters in eastern China.

Busch disclosed the latest Anheuser-Busch venture overseas after a luncheon meeting of corporate chief executives with President Bill Clinton at the White House. Busch praised Clinton's first year in office, singling out the administration's successes on deficit reduction and enactment of the North American Free Trade Agreement.

"I'd say an 'A,'" Busch said when asked how he would grade Clinton's performance.

Busch said that if Clinton succeeds in securing a new world trade agreement, it would mean a million new jobs over the next decade. For Anheuser-Busch, he said, the agreement means new

markets overseas.

"Right now," he said, "we have very low barriers coming in on beer products shipped into the U.S., but going outbound there are barriers in all the countries we ship to. Their tariffs are much higher than ours — two, three, four, five, 10 times higher — so it's a big step for companies like ours if we're able to get the barriers down."

The company's investment in Tsingtao is one of four alliances Anheuser-Busch has formed with foreign brewers this year. The others are in Mexico, Japan and Italy.

Tsingtao is the largest of about 800 brewers in China. Its market share is just 2.4 percent, but in a country of 1.2 billion people, the potential for growth is huge. Anheuser-Busch announced last June that it had bought 5 percent of Tsingtao's stock for \$16.4 million.

Jack H. Purnell, chairman of Anheuser-Busch International Inc., issued a statement Tuesday saying that "negotiations are in progress" with Tsingtao and that "one of our objectives is to build a brewery in China, in partnership with Tsingtao."

Anheuser-Busch is among companies that have pushed the administration hard to maintain most-favored-nation trading status for China.

Senator's mother dies in Chicago

CHICAGO — U.S. Sen. Carol Moseley-Braun's mother, Edna Moseley, has died of lung cancer. She was 71.

The money should have been reported to the state, which might have used some of it to defray Mrs. Moseley's state-supported care.

Instead, Moseley-Braun helped her mother distribute the money among herself and other family members. In the final week of the campaign, Moseley-Braun paid the state \$15,239.92 to cover what should have been used for her mother's medical expenses.

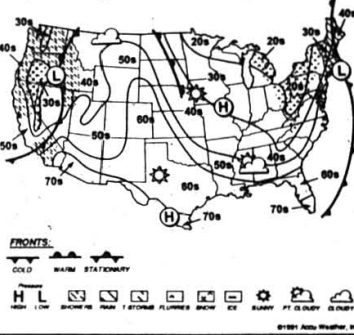

Unarmed man is shot by officer after city hall melee

CENTRALIA — Authorities have asked a grand jury and the FBI to investigate the police shooting and killing of an unarmed man who earlier had shot his estranged wife.

State Police revealed Thursday that a probationary police officer shot Jerry Glispie, 36, in the arm, chest and legs after the man had been disarmed by Centralia Police Chief Arland Speidel.

Speidel earlier had said Glispie shot his wife, Nesrin Glispie, 26, outside city hall, then entered the building and was shot after he refused orders to lay down his weapon. Captain Roland Miller said he did not know the basis of those reports and Speidel was not available for comment, he said.

State Police Capt. Dennis Lovell said Thursday that Speidel was escorting Glispie through the station when Officer Dave Nicol — who was told by a dispatcher that an armed man was in the station — saw him and fired five shots.

"He did not know that the chief had met Mr. Glispie and taken the gun away from him," Lovell said.

The officer also thought he heard Glispie yelling "Come and get me" and could not see the man's right hand or the chief, Lovell said.

Jerry Glispie's mother demanded action be taken against the officer.

"He didn't see a gun?" said another Glispie of Centralia

trained better."

Nicol was placed on administrative leave with pay, pending an investigation. He joined the force about eight months ago, a police spokesman said.

Marion County State's Attorney James Creason said a grand jury would be convened to investigate the incident. City officials promised to ask the FBI to determine if there were any civil rights violations, and a coroner's inquest was scheduled for Tuesday.

Glispie's wife was in stable condition at St. Louis University Hospital on Thursday. She had obtained a permanent order of protection from her husband less than an hour before he shot her.

Lovell said Mrs. Glispie had come to the police station with a friend to drop off a copy of the protection order and report that her husband had abducted their two children.

Jerry Glispie confronted his wife and, after a brief verbal exchange, fired six shots at her, striking her twice in the face and once in the right arm. The friend ran away and was not injured.

Coroner Dan Fischer said the circumstances surrounding Glispie's death were "full of tragic stories."

"Jerry Glispie's actions on Dec. 6, 1993, showed him to be a man whose mental torment over his family separation from his wife and children grew to an unbearable burden," Fischer said.

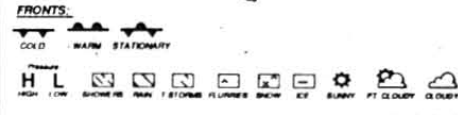
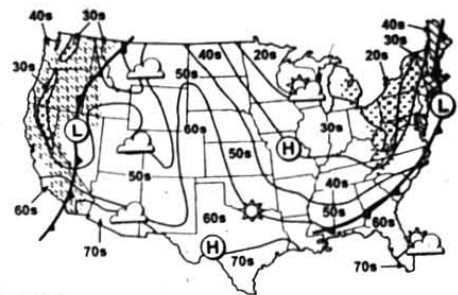

Decision on ethanol brings howls of protest

PEORIA — Farmers and ethanol producers expressed disbelief and disgust today at word that the Clinton administration has decided to exclude ethanol from a new smog-reducing gasoline.

Illinois, the nation's top producer of ethanol, stands to lose as much as any Midwest state under the decision revealed by administration officials who spoke on the condition of anonymity.

"This is a black day for U.S. corn producers," said farmer

Scott Durbin of Owaneco, who was attending the Ethanol Research and Development Conference in Peoria.

Other conference attendees said they couldn't believe Clinton would allow such a decision.

"It's a major betrayal to farmers in the Midwest and ethanol manufacturers," said Allen Grosboll, executive assistant to Gov. Jim Edgar.

Grosboll said candidate Clinton had attacked President Bush for not moving fast enough on ethanol.

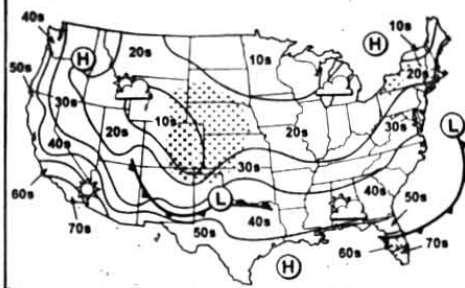

Two charged with starving infant

CHICAGO — When 5-month-old Tavanisha Brooks died, she was only 14 ounces heavier than at birth.

On Wednesday, Katrina Vincent, 20, and James Brooks, 23, were charged with murder, accused of failing to provide her with enough food to keep her alive.

A judge also ordered the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services to take custody of three other children who lived with the couple in a small, two-bedroom apartment in Joliet.

Authorities said Vincent called 911 Monday morning to report her child in distress. After paramedics responded, Tavanisha was pronounced dead on arrival at 11:15 a.m. at Silver Cross Hospital.

"It was painfully obvious this child had not been fed," said State's Attorney James Glasgow.

Court upholds murder conviction

CHICAGO — An appeals court has upheld the conviction and life sentence of one of two men convicted of the 1991 kidnapping and slaying of Waukegan attorney Robert Snook Jr.

Charles Ratzke, 27, had contended in his appeal to the Illinois Appellate Court in Elgin that his natural life sentence was unjustified.

A three-judge panel of appellate judges unanimously disagreed. The ruling was received Wednesday by Lake County State's Atty. Michael J. Waller, who represented Ratzke and a

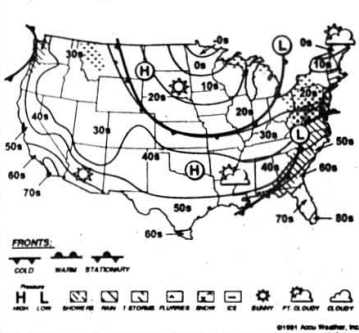

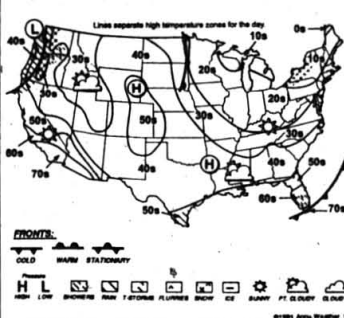

Moseley-Braun is Clinton's chief backer

WASHINGTON — No one in Congress can top Sen. Carol Moseley-Braun of Illinois when votes are cast to support President Clinton.

The first-term Democrat backed the president more than any other lawmaker in 1993, according to a new study of congressional voting records.

In the House, Rep. Phil Crane of Mount Prospect ranked second among Republicans in voting against the Democratic president. And Rep. Glenn Poshard, D-Marion, bucked his party's leader 43 percent of the time,

sixth highest among House Democrats.

Moseley-Braun, in her first year, backed Clinton on 99 percent of the 89 Senate roll call votes in which the president had a clearly defined position, according to Congressional Quarterly's annual analysis of congressional voting patterns.

Tied at 98 percent were Sen. Christopher Dodd, D-Conn., and Rep. Jim Bacchus, D-Fla.

Clinton received the highest support from Congress of any president since Lyndon Johnson in 1965, said the study by the politically independent journal. Clinton won 86.4 percent of the

votes in which he took a position.

Illinois' senior senator, Paul Simon, supported the White House 96 percent of the time.

In the House, where Democrats hold a 12-8 edge in the state's delegation, only four Democrats had support ratings below 75 percent: Poshard, 57 percent; Lane Evans of Rock Island, 71 percent; Jerry Costello of Belleville, 71 percent; and William Lipinski of Chicago, 69 percent, including the only "no" vote among Illinois Democrats on the budget.

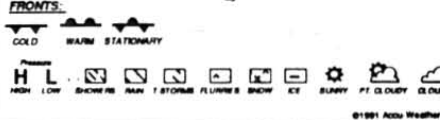
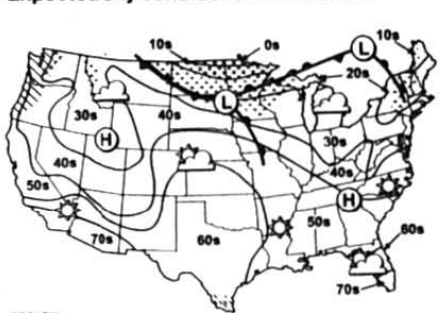
