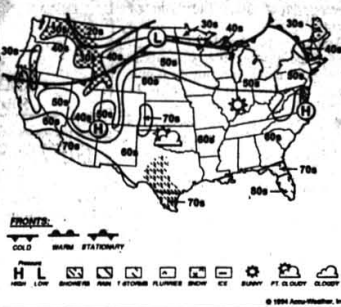

Judge makes abortion order permanent

CHICAGO — A federal judge today issued a permanent order requiring the state to provide Medicaid-funded abortions to women in cases of rape or incest, thwarting a legislative attempt to defy a federal mandate.

U.S. Judge Charles Kocoras's permanent injunction solidifies his temporary order on Nov. 21. At that time, the judge said the state must comply with federal regulations if it accepts federal money. Medicaid is jointly funded by the federal and state

governments.

In mid-November, the state Legislature's Joint Committee on Rules voted to abolish immediately the Edgar administration's emergency rule allowing for Medicaid funding in cases of rape or incest. Lawmakers said a state agency should not make such a rule without the Legislature first passing a law on the matter.

Edgar had the rule put in place in July to comply with a 1993 federal mandate that added rape and incest as cases under which poor women are entitled to Medicaid-paid abortions. Protecting a pregnant woman's life already was covered by Medicaid.

Only four Medicaid-funded abortions for rape and incest vic-

tims were performed between July and mid-November, according to the Illinois Department of Public Aid.

On Friday, a Cook County Circuit Court judge struck down an Illinois law allowing the state to pay for an abortion only when a woman's life is in danger, extending the benefit to cases where a doctor determines a woman's health is jeopardized by carrying a pregnancy to term. The state plans to appeal.

EUREKA — A woman convicted of child abuse and ordered not to become pregnant again has gotten pregnant. Prosecutors want to revoke her probation and send her to prison.

Susie J. Ferrell, a 21-year-old El Paso resident, was convicted in April of aggravated battery of a child. She was accused of trying to smother her infant son in December 1993.

Woodford County Circuit Judge Richard Baner sentenced her to three months in jail and four years probation. One condition of her probation was that she get regular pregnancy tests and make reasonable efforts to avoid becoming pregnant.


But a pregnancy test came back positive Monday.

Woodford County State's Attorney John Huschen says he has filed a petition to revoke probation.

If he proves Ferrell violated probation, she could be re-sentenced. Her offense carries a maximum penalty of 15 years in prison.

Ferrell's son and his 4-year-old sister are now in foster care.

Judge releases pair who were on FBI list

CHICAGO — Donna Willmott and Claude Marks spent nine years on the FBI's most wanted list, living under assumed names. Now a federal judge says they're no longer dangerous or likely to flee.

On Tuesday, U.S. District Judge James Moran ordered the pair, accused of plotting to blow up part of Leavenworth Penitentiary, freed on \$100,000 bonds.

That ruling came despite objections from prosecutors who said Willmott and Marks were uncooperative, but after testimony from friends who spoke of the pair's exemplary, quiet lives in Pittsburgh in recent years.

Willmott, 44, and Marks, 45, surrendered in Chicago last week to face charges in the 1985 plot.

After the court hearing, Willmott's attorney, Jan Susler, said the two would live in Chicago with friends and relatives while they're free on bond.

The two refused to comment after leaving Chicago's Metropolitan Correctional Center on Tuesday.

Defense attorneys said the bond was secured by Marks' father and friends of Willmott with a combination of home equity and bearer bonds. The two are required to surrender again Jan. 9 to face new charges under

a plea agreement.

In opposing bond, Assistant U.S. Attorney Deborah Devaney said the defendants "have been living an entire life of deception."

"They did not come in and surrender and say, 'We want atone for our sins.' They carefully manipulated their surrender" and negotiated for a year to get the best benefit, Devaney said.

But defense attorneys said the defendants, originally from San Francisco, had been leading quiet, upstanding lives for the past several years under assumed names.

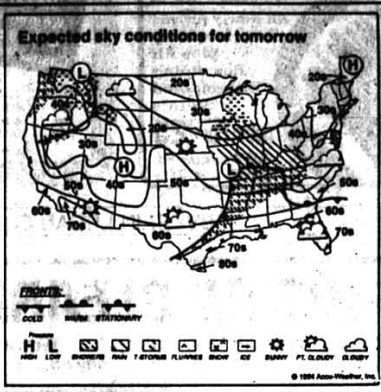

Smith said two younger children and two adults, Otis and Carol Shelton, escaped the Sunday morning blaze with only minor injuries. Carol Shelton was the mother of all five children, Golby said.

Smith said the family was traveling to El Dorado, Ark., and decided to spend the night in their camper van outside a relative's house about five miles

north of Leland.

"Apparently while they were sleeping in their camper van, a blanket fell from an elevated bunk onto the open flame heater, setting the blanket on fire and then the camper van," the coroner said.

He said the two adults and two small children who were sleeping with them in the front of the van were able to escape.

"This was investigated by the fire marshal and no foul play was found," Smith said. "The cause of death will be accidental death due to a motor vehicle fire."

Kewanee School Superintendent James Golby said Bethany, Michelle and Rosalind were new to the school district this year.

"There aren't words to express one's feelings in tragedies like this," Golby said.

Board of Trade

CHICAGO (AP) — Wheat futures prices rose modestly in early trading today on the Chicago Board of Trade on news of a flurry of export sales. Other grain and soybean futures were steady to slightly lower.

The Agriculture Department announced U.S.-subsidized sales of wheat to China, Pakistan, Egypt, Bangladesh and the Philippines. The largest sale was 300,000 metric tons to the Philippines. China's purchase of 199,000 metric tons marked its return to the market after buying about 2 million metric tons last week.

Corn and soybean futures were little changed. Soybeans were caught between a modest increase in soybean oil values and a sharp drop in soybean meal prices. Forecasts for beneficial rain in Brazil and Argentina, where soybean crops are thriving, put additional pressure on prices, analysts said.

In early trading, wheat for March delivery was 2 1/4 cents higher at \$4.05 1/4 a bushel. March corn was unchanged at \$2.31 1/4 a bushel. March oats were 1/4 cent lower at \$1.22 1/4 a bushel. January soybeans were 1/4 cent lower at \$5.56 1/4 a bushel.

Grain and soybean futures ended mostly lower Thursday. Livestock and meat futures were mostly higher in early trading on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, paced by strong gains in the deferred hog and pork belly contracts in reaction to a USDA report.

Illinois Power wants to trim payroll costs

DECATUR — Illinois Power Co. plans to offer early retirement to up to 650 employees, about 15 percent of its work force, to improve service while lowering costs.

The company on Thursday said it will offer early retirement to about 200 of its 1,600 salaried workers in the fourth quarter of 1995 and take a \$22 million charge in that period to cover the cost.

The savings will amount to \$15 million in 1996 and increase thereafter, the Decatur-based utility said.

Illinois Power also said it hopes to offer early retirement to 450 of its 2,800 union employees, pending the outcome of negotiations with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. Those talks are scheduled to start in January.

"We anticipate that by the time all the dust settles, there will be 650 fewer people at Illinois Power than today," spokesman Craig Nesbit said.

"We expect that early retirements will be able to accommodate whatever reductions we ultimately need to take and that layoffs will not be necessary. We will use them only as a last resort," Nesbit said.

Illinois Power has cut its work force to 4,400 from 4,650 since early 1992.

Reductions so far have been handled through attrition and an "employee pool," which puts displaced employees to work on special projects while they seek other positions in the company.

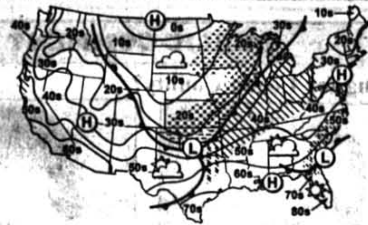
