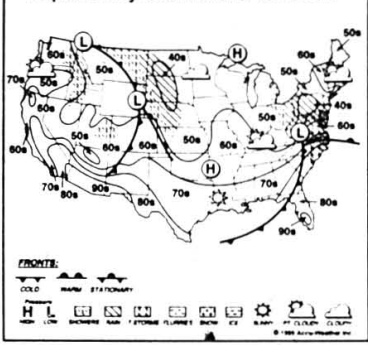

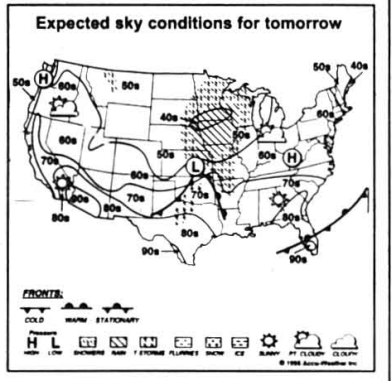

**Richard Daley takes 3rd oath as Chicago boss**

CHICAGO (AP) — Mayor Richard M. Daley says priorities in his second full term will be improving the city's schools and working with the state on various projects.

Daley, City Clerk James Laski, City Treasurer Miriam Santos and 50 aldermen were sworn in Monday.

With Gov. Jim Edgar and other government and civic leaders looking on, Daley was sworn in by U.S. District Judge Abraham Lincoln Marovitz, who gave the oath of office to Daley, six times as mayor.

It was Daley's third swearing-in. He served two years after a special election following the death of Mayor Harold Washington.

In a reference to recent efforts by Illinois Republicans to wrest away control of the city's airports, Daley said he will always stand up when the interests of Chicago are threatened.

But Daley said he also was interested in working out his differences with Edgar and legislative leaders.

**Board of Trade**  
 CHICAGO (AP) — Wheat and corn futures prices extended their gains in early trading today on the Chicago Board of Trade after the Agriculture Department reported slow progress in planting those crops.

Wheat futures also were supported by news the USDA targeted China for sales of an additional 1 million metric tons of U.S. wheat at subsidized prices

The U.S. spring wheat crop was just 14 percent planted as of Sunday compared with the five-year average of 49 percent for that date, the Agriculture Department reported late Monday after trading ended.

Corn was 10 percent planted compared with the norm of 23 percent, the USDA said

Excessive rain in the Northern Plains and Midwest has kept farmers from their fields. The wet pattern will continue at least through the middle of next week, the National Weather Service predicted in a medium-range forecast late Monday.

In early trading, July wheat was up 1 1/4 cents at \$3.60 a bushel. May corn was 1 1/4 cents higher at \$2.52 1/4 a bushel. May oats were 1 cent lower at \$1.38 1/4 a bushel. May soybeans were 1 cent higher at \$5.77 1/4 a bushel

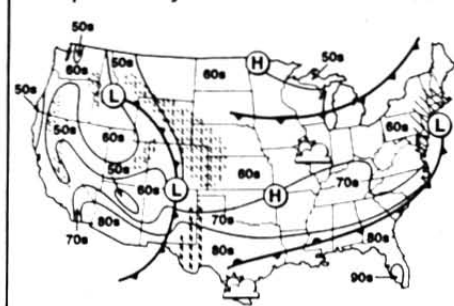

**Victim's daughter wants killer executed**

 SPRINGFIELD — Jean B Moore fought tears while describing how she found the body of her father, Charles Biebel, just days before Christmas.  
 "I found him sitting in his wheelchair dead, with a bloody wound in his chest," she said. "For the past 16 years, I have tried to erase that image from my mind, but I have not succeeded."  
 Givries Davis, convicted of four murders, is scheduled to die by lethal injection at Stateville Correctional Center on Wednesday for the 1978 shooting death of Biebel, an 89-year-old Belleville.  
 Davis' attorneys, who have taken their efforts to prevent the

execution to the Internet, asked the Prisoner Review Board on Thursday to recommend clemency to the governor. The 11-member board's recommendation is confidential.  
 Attorneys say Davis, 37, was illiterate when the crime occurred, suffered borderline mental retardation and had a history of mental problems. They contend he couldn't have crafted the confessions used to convict him.  
 "This is the kind of evidence that should have made a difference if offered in mitigation to a sentencing jury," attorney Barry Levenstam said.  
 The Rev. Oscar Waden, a Chicago death penalty opponent, also claimed investigators threatened to shoot Davis if he didn't

confess.  
 "I have never put a gun to anyone's head. I have never coerced a confession," said Capt. James Lay of the St. Clair County Sheriff's Department.  
 After about 16 years in prison, Davis has learned to read and has become an ordained minister, his advocates say.  
 "I just think he is a changed man and I think you should consider giving him clemency," Davis' nephew, Eric Turner, said.  
 Prosecutors doubt any prison conversion, saying Davis had disciplinary problems as late as 1993.

**Labor panel drops charges in Bridgestone-URW dispute**

 WASHINGTON — The National Labor Relations Board has dismissed bad-faith bargaining charges by both parties in the United Rubber Workers strike against Bridgestone-Firestone Inc.  
 More than 4,000 workers struck plants of the nation's No. 3 tire maker last July in Decatur, Ill., Oklahoma City and Des Moines, Iowa, and a Bridgestone-Firestone research center in Akron, Ohio.  
 The agency on Thursday said both parties had filed numerous charges against each other since negotiations failed to produce an agreement. The charges were dismissed by the NLRB's regional office in Indianapolis.  
 But officials there have authorized a complaint alleging the company illegally discontinued accident and sickness benefits for employees on disability during the strike and by unilaterally instituting new medical coverage requirements.  
 The NLRB also said com-

plaints have been authorized by its regional offices in Indianapolis, Kansas City and Peoria, Ill., alleging that terminations of several strikers violated the National Labor Relations Act.  
 A pending issue related to those findings is whether the dispute had converted from an economic strike to an unfair labor practice strike.  
 The status of the strike is significant, the NLRB said, because economic strikers can be replaced permanently but unfair labor practice strikers cannot.  
 The NLRB also has authorized a complaint against the union alleging picket line misconduct.  
 Striking workers at a Bridgestone-Firestone plant in Decatur voted earlier this week to return unconditionally to their jobs. But the company has been non-committal about how many union members would be called back. About 1,250 union members worked at the plant, and the company has hired 900 replacements since the strike began.

**Baby's adoptive parents call for peace**

CHICAGO — Baby Richard's adoptive parents called for an end to death threats against his biological parents, saying vengeance is not the solution to their plight.

Robert and Kimberly Warburton, who fought a four-year custody battle with biological parents Otakar and Daniela Kirchner, made their appeal Monday in a statement issued by their attorneys.

"We have heard reports that the Kirchners have received death threats," they said. "We ask that such threats please stop."

"Richard's emotional and physical well-being have always

been our primary concern," they said. "He was raised in an environment where violence and vengeance are not condoned and are not believed to be the solution. Thank you for considering our thoughts and feelings in this matter."

The Warburtons, reluctantly bowing to an Illinois Supreme Court order, relinquished custody of the 4-year-old on April 30. He has been living with the Kirchners since then.

The Warburtons are hoping the U.S. Supreme Court will give them back the youngster they took home from the hospital when he was 4 days old and raised along with their biological son.

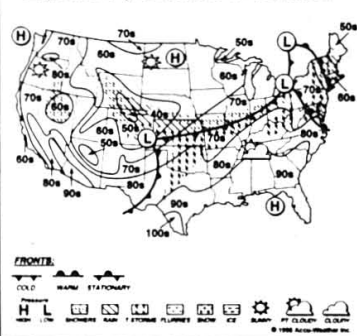

# Society's singers, musician share favorites 'Chicago's Cardinal Bernardin picks up medal at Notre Dame

Lincoln area music lovers had the pleasure this weekend of listening to the hometown version of a community concert performed by Lincoln Area Music Society's Chorale and Orchestra.

Performances were given Saturday night and Sunday afternoon in the Johnston Center for the Performing Arts at Lincoln College.

The annual spring concert offers local musicians the opportunity to share with the public their latest musical offerings, including the many different kinds of music the volunteer group has enjoyed practicing together since their annual winter concert.

While the winter concert tends to focus on the popular and sacred make-you-feel-good holiday music, the spring concert features some unusual and

interesting fun-to-listen-to music selected from a wide range of sources.

Both the chorale and the orchestra seemed to sparkle in the faster tempo tunes, including the orchestra's "Gaslight Gaieties" medley of 1890s music and their "Looney Tunes Overture."

The chorale's "Crazy Cantata" was a fun version of the old round, "Three Blind Mice." The musicians seemed to be having as much fun as the audience in these numbers.

The chorale, directed by Richard Reinwald, got off to a rousing start with "Sing (sing a song)" from Sesame Street, followed by the beautiful "Speak Softly, Love," the love theme

from "Godfather."

Some portions of the program were much more serious, ambitious or complex, like "Circle of Life," from the "The Lion King," "Suite from Tannhauser" and the final portion of the program when the orchestra and chorus joined together to present "A Saga of Western America," narrated by Reinwald.

The orchestra, directed by Julie Kasa, was impressive in the Bizet number, the "Russian Chorale and Overture," a medley of traditional Russian folk tunes.

The program was hosted by Richard Sumrall and also included a special feature - a lesson by Marge Iden in how to play the vibraphone.

"That can give you an idea what different kinds of sounds

can come from the same mallets," she said.

Her portion of the program involved several medleys, or "sets," of hymns, including spirituals and several of her personal favorites.

Praise should be given to the two accompanists, Maria Brooker and Debbie Poynter who, as always, were excellent.

Noteworthy among the many other people who performed especially well in their portions of the program were flutist Beth Anderson, who had beautiful solo parts in "Phantom of the Opera" and "Shenandoah," and Dee Ebel who was delightful as the farmer's wife in "Three Blind Mice."

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — Cardinal Joseph Bernardin of Chicago was awarded the Laetare Medal for distinguished Catholics at Notre Dame University's graduation ceremonies.

"The medal will motivate me to use whatever qualities God has given me in a way that will make a difference, for others as well as myself, in the years that lie ahead," Bernardin said Sunday during the university's 150th commencement, where more than 2,300 students received degrees.

The Laetare Medal, established in 1883 at Notre Dame, is awarded annually to a Catholic who illustrates the ideals of the church and has enriched the heritage of humanity.

In November 1993, Bernardin was accused of sexual molestation by a man who later recanted the charges. Bernardin later met

with his accuser and forgave him, and his compassion was cited by Notre Dame officials when the Laetare Medal was awarded.

"You faced the later discredited charges with humility, you met your former accuser with charity and forgiveness, and you provided us all with an example of personal reconciliation which has since become a treasure of our church," read the citation honoring Bernardin.

Bernardin did not mention the episode during his speech, although he spoke about the importance of faith.

## Hospital spokesman downplays profit report

SPRINGFIELD — The \$755 million Illinois hospitals earned in 1993 may sound high, but an industry representative says when spread out over 230 hospitals, "it is not that big a number."

A state study released Thursday found Illinois hospitals earned at least \$755 million in 1993, and more hospitals recorded a profit than in either of the previous two years.

"I venture to say those bottom lines are not evenly distributed," said David Harris, a senior vice president with the Illinois Hospital and Health Systems Association.

The findings could figure heavily as lawmakers debate a tax on health care providers that generates about \$300 million for Medicaid, the state-federal health care program for the poor.

"If the budget goes through with the provider tax in place, it would have a significant impact on a major number of hospitals," Harris said.

Gov. Jim Edgar's \$33 billion budget calls for continuing the provider tax, which is scheduled to end June 30. Under the governor's plan, revenues from the

tax would finance the \$5.3 billion program for fiscal 1996.

Hospital groups say the tax — 1.88 percent of gross revenues — severely strains many hospitals.

The study by the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Board found that 162 of the hospitals sampled made money in 1993, compared with 148 in 1992 and 149 in 1991. Most profits fell between \$1 million and \$10 million.

Twenty-one hospitals reported a loss, down from 34 in 1992 and 33 in 1991.

Responses to the survey came from 218 of the state's 230 hospitals, and 183 provided financial data needed to make the comparison.

The Illinois Medicaid program has between \$1.3 billion and \$1.4 billion in unpaid bills, and financing the program has become the defining issue of budget negotiations, Republicans say.

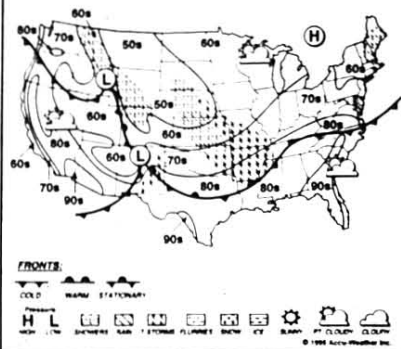

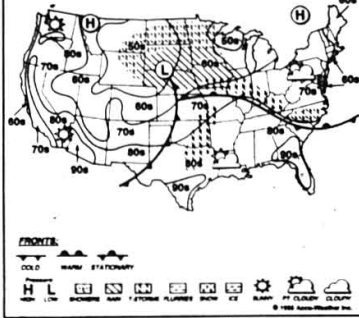

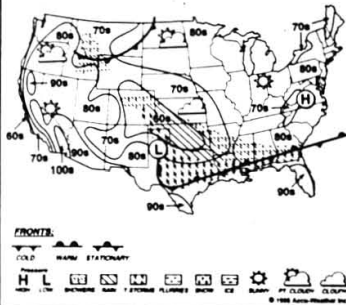
