MURPHYSBORO - A father awaiting trial for abducting his daughter from her Carbondale classroom at gunpoint was told today that he could walk out of jail for \$150,000 bond.


ALTON — An Alton physi-cian was struck by two vehicles and killed while jogging along Illinios Route 140. Dr. Chester Hill, 49 died







Two die in pickup-school bus collision


