**Cracks begin showing as Decatur labor rally fizzles**

DECATUR — Although there were enough voices to make shouts of "Solidarity!" ring in the Decatur Civic Center, more than 300 empty seats in the 500-seat theater highlighted the cracks in the collective armor of Decatur's three most prominent unions.

Union leaders were embarrassed by the low turnout for a rally Sunday that was supposed to highlight the unity of the unions in seeking solutions to longtime labor battles.

"After years without contracts, many of us have gotten tired," said Larry G. Solomon, president of United Auto Workers Local 751. "But when you look at the alternatives, you know you can't give up."

Solomon apologized for his local's turnout. Although local officers called many of the 1,700 active members, only

about 40 were present.

However, Solomon said he was pleased that members of Peoria Local 974 drove down for the rally.

The event marked four years the UAW has been without a contract with Caterpillar Inc.; three years that United Paperworkers Local 7837 has been without a contract with A.E. Staley Mfg. Co.; and 18 months that United Steel Workers, formerly United Rubber Workers, Local 713 has been without a contract with Bridgestone-Firestone Inc.

Dave Watts, United Paperworkers Local 7837 president, said the cancellation of leading AFL-CIO presidential candidate John Sweeney might have affected the turnout.

Sweeney, president of the Service Employees International Union, canceled Saturday, citing a conflict in his schedule.

**LeRoy man found bleeding in vehicle near Lincoln dies**

A LeRoy man died Monday after he was found bleeding at 3:15 p.m. Sunday in his car on Interstate 55 near Lincoln.

Charles Barclay, 62, was found in his car unconscious and with multiple lacerations to his arms after his vehicle stopped in the middle of traffic on I-55, according to an Illinois State Police report.

Barclay was taken to Memorial Medical Center in Springfield where he died at 11:27 a.m. Monday, according to the Sangamon County Coroner's office.

An autopsy was conducted and the coroner's office is awaiting the results. An inquest also is expected to take place in the next two weeks.

The only damage to the vehicle was the windshield, which had been shattered with a circular hole, according to the police report.

It appeared Barclay, who is believed to have Alzheimer's disease, put his fist through the glass at sometime earlier in the trip.

**\$150,000 bond set for dad in kidnapping case**

MURPHYSBORO — A father awaiting trial for abducting his daughter from her Carbondale classroom at gunpoint was told today that he could walk out of jail for \$150,000 bond.

Former Lincoln resident John Moro, 34, had been held without bond since being extradited from Washington state Thursday on charges of aggravated kidnapping. His 7-year-old daughter has been returned to her adoptive mother.

A Jackson County judge had set bond at \$100,000 when Moro was first charged the day of the abduction, Aug. 28. That bond was revoked after Moro was arrested in Ellensburg, Wash., on Sept. 12.

State's Attorney Mike Wepesic argued bond should be set at \$500,000 because Moro showed he is an escape risk by fleeing 1,600 miles with his daughter. Moro also had \$6,800 in cash on him when he was arrested in Ellensburg and that money was returned to him.

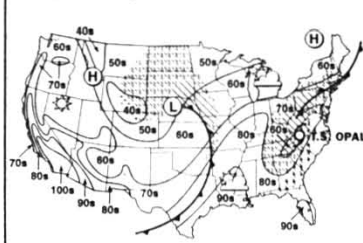

**CHICAGO (AP)** — Soybean futures prices rose modestly in early trading today on the Chicago Board of Trade in anticipation of stronger world demand for vegetable oils.  
 The buying was prompted by a sharp jump in the price of Malaysian palm oil, which competes with U.S. soybean oil on the world market, amid talk India is preparing to buy large amounts of palm oil.  
 The early gains were limited by persistent reports of better soybean yields than traders expected from the advancing U.S. harvest. Soybean harvesting was 15 percent complete as of Sunday, according to an Agriculture Department report.

Corn harvesting was 17 percent complete as of Sunday, the USDA said.

WASHINGTON — Round the corner too fast in the Cannon House Office Building and you might walk by Room 312 without realizing it.

The wooden nameplates are gone. In their place is a single white sheet of paper with "Office of the Second Congressional District of Illinois" in black letters.

Mel Reynolds once called this suite his legislative home. Now he sits in a minimum-security prison in Southern Illinois, serving a five-year sentence for having sex with an underage campaign worker.

Voters in the South Side and suburban Chicago district will choose a successor in a special election Dec. 12. Until then, the House clerk's office is supervising Reynolds' Capitol Hill office and district offices in Chicago and Homewood.

About a dozen staffers in the Illinois offices continue to handle constituent requests. In Washington, the workload only

requires two aides. The clerk's office has not fired or hired anyone since it took charge Oct. 1, when Reynolds' resignation took effect. But the staff's employment ends after the special election.

The clerk refused a reporter's request to spend time in the Cannon office observing what the remaining staffers — legislative assistant Tara Harrison and office director Kim Williams —

do. Neither wanted to speak about their duties.

Under House rules, the clerk manages House offices when a lawmaker dies, resigns or is expelled. In the last session of Congress, the clerk handled nine vacancies due to death or resignation. Now it is handling two, those of Reynolds and Norman Mineta, a California Democrat who quit to take a business job.

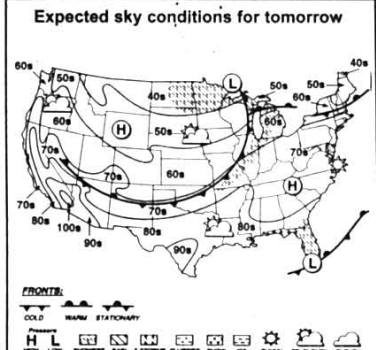

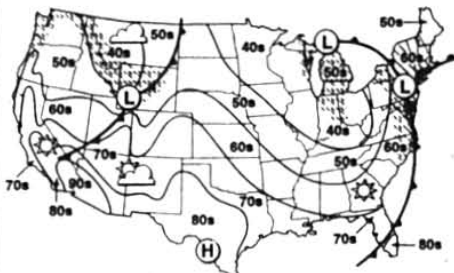

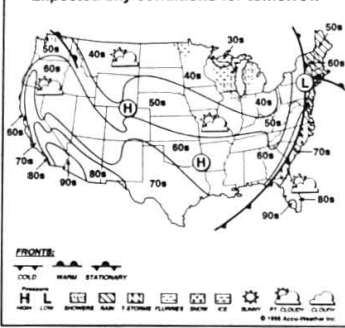
