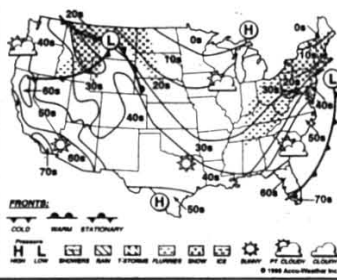

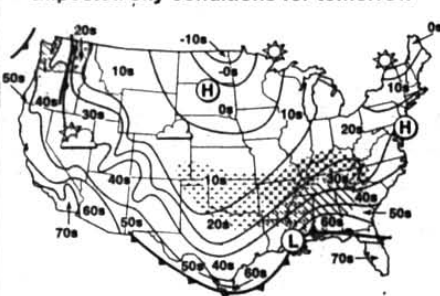

Local USDA agency office offers financing for rural home repairs

THE COURIER

Rural homeowners in Logan County who need to fix up their homes may be eligible for financing from the Rural Economic and Community Development division of the U.S. Agriculture Department.

Michael A. Booher, field office manager, said that in addition to financing new homes, the agency also has funds available to families to purchase an existing home.

RECD also makes loans to remove health or safety hazards from homes owned by very low income and elderly families, Booher said.

Income is the key to the type of assistance available through RECD, Booher said. If income is very low, a repair loan may be used to remove health hazards such as repairing roofs, providing sanitary water and waste disposal systems, installing storm doors and screens, insulating homes and upgrading electrical wiring.

Eligibility rules require applicants to own and live in a home or on a farm in the open country, or in a town having less than 10,000 population. All areas in Logan County are eligible for these types of loans. Also,

the applicant must be unable to obtain credit from a regular commercial lender.

Burglar demands 12-year sentence; he gets an even 100

PRINCETON — Burglar Dennis Pullen thought he knew what was fair, so he spoke up and told the judge not to give him more than 12 years in prison.

The judge gave him 100 years. Now the 36-year-old career criminal won't be eligible for parole until he is 92.

Pullen has had 25 felony convictions over the past 20 years, with more charges pending.

Tuesday's sentencing in Bureau County involved a string of burglaries. Pullen had gotten 12-year sentences after pleading guilty to burglary in other counties, and he said anything more "is totally unjust."

"Mr. Pullen, you have lost your right to live among us, sir," replied Circuit Judge Terence Madsen. "Go to jail."

Shutdown delays crop report

CHAMPAIGN — The federal government shutdown that ended this week has delayed release of the final report on the 1995 grain harvest, the Illinois Agricultural Statistics Service said.

The Agriculture Department report due out today contains the final harvest tallies for corn, soybeans and other grain crops. The USDA now plans to release the report Tuesday.

A soggy spring and scorching summer helped make the 1995 harvest one of the smallest in recent years. The small harvest and a December USDA report showing an increase in swine herds drove corn and soybean prices sharply higher.

While corn prices fell earlier this week with the news of favorable weather for South Amer-

ican growers, grain prices should stay high through this summer, said market expert Darrel Good of the University of Illinois.

"The current supplies and worry about the coming crop year won't go away overnight," Good said.

There is "some potential for surprise one way or the other" with the final crop numbers, however, Good said.

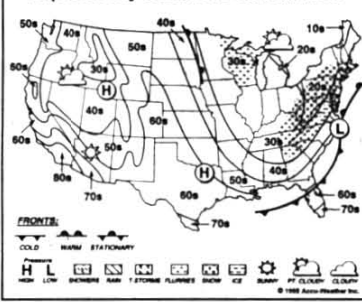
The high grain prices may force some hog producers to reduce their herds, which could further drive down hog prices, Good said. But consumers probably won't see much difference in price at the supermarket, he added.

"The cost of the raw product is a relatively small percentage of prices at the retail level," Good said.

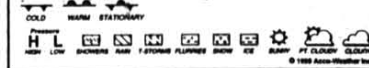
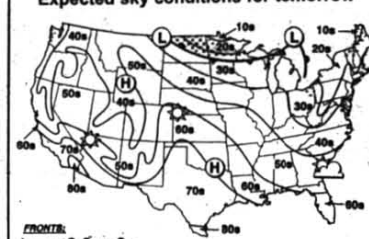

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain and soybeans futures prices were mostly higher in early trading today on the Chicago Board of Trade following recent losses.

Soybean futures prices also moved higher amid rumors China is in the market this year for 1 million tons of soybeans.

Grain futures had been pressured by continuing rain in major growing regions in Argentina and Brazil, but traders said the potential benefits to the corn and soybean crops there had been factored into the market over the last several days.

Wheat continues to face pressure as investors await word of potential sales to China. IBM for March delivery rose 5 1/2 cents to \$4 94 1/2 a bushel; March corn rose 2 1/2 cents to \$3.60 a bushel; March oats rose 2 1/2 cents to \$2.21 a bushel, and January soybeans rose 2 1/4 cents to \$2.28 a bushel.

Meat and livestock futures prices were mostly higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

February live cattle rose 20 cent to 65.82 cents a pound; January feeder cattle rose 10 cent to 60.05 cents a pound; February live hogs rose .03 cent to 46.15 cents a pound; February frozen pork bellies rose .08 cent to 55.70 cents a pound.

Wall Street at noon

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks were sharply lower at midday after a wave of computerized sell programs in late morning erased modest opening gains.

At noon on Wall Street, the Dow Jones

industrial average was down 26.74 at 5,038.36. The blue-chip index gave up gains of more than 20 points posted at the open.

Declining issues led advances by about 3 to 1 on the New York Stock Exchange. Volume was 185.7 million shares, off of Thursday's pace of 195.7 million.

Broad market indexes were mostly lower. The NYSE composite index was down 1.86 at 321.62. The Standard & Poor's 500 composite was off 3.63 at 599.06, the American Stock Exchange's market value index was down 3.13 at 533.97, and the Nasdaq composite was off 6.86 at 1,004.44.

"This market really rolled over," said Arthur Hogan, the top stock trader at Dean Witter Reynolds. "There were some signs of follow-through from yesterday's gains at the open, but they didn't hold. The sell programs got triggered and exaggerated things."

The 30-year Treasury bond also slipped, trading down 1/2 point and yielding 6.18 percent.

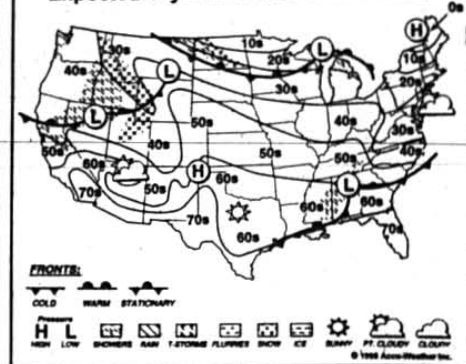

Prisoner's fate may be decided by appeals panel

VIENNA — Lee Otis Griffin's 15-year fight to get out of prison for a triple slaying he insists he did not commit may be decided in a few minutes by the 7th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals on Wednesday.

Last June, a federal magistrate ruled Griffin must either be freed or retried because his original trial was unfair. State prosecutors immediately appealed.

"It's down to the wire, and all the issues are on the table," Griffin, 37, said from Shawnee Correctional Center on Monday. Griffin was charged with three East St. Louis murders in 1981. He was convicted sentenced to 40 years for the killings and 30 years for armed violence.

After years of court motions, a breakthrough came in November 1994. The 7th Circuit in Chicago ordered U.S. Magistrate Gerald Cohn to give the case a "more searching examination."

Cohn then ruled Griffin received ineffective counsel because his attorney also represented a co-defendant. Cohn ordered Griffin released in 90 days or retried.

The 7th Circuit ruled in July that Griffin must remain in prison until the state's appeal was heard.

On Wednesday, the appeals court will consider the prosecution's appeal of Cohn's ruling as well as a request by Griffin that he be released while awaiting the outcome of the appeal.

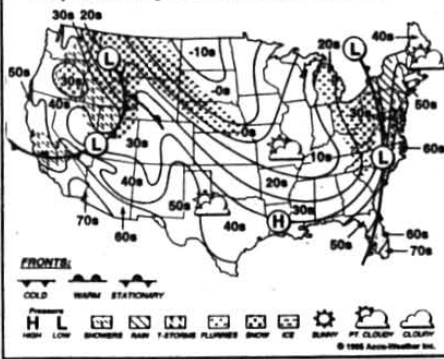

"We are the recognized leader in a tough global market," said Caterpillar Chairman Donald Fites. "And we're determined to stay competitive and profitable

no matter what the future holds."

Caterpillar set the new marks despite labor turmoil and its own warnings that the industry was beginning to slump. The third quarter had produced a 13 percent drop in profits.

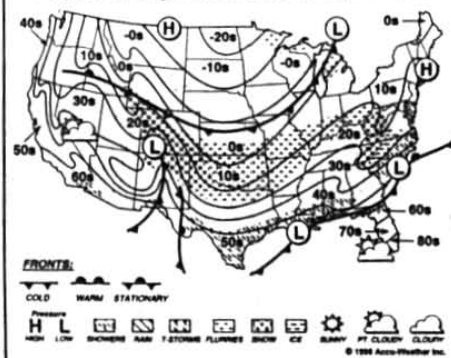
