Five die when plane carrying skydivers crashes

BREMERTON, Wash. — Four men and a woman died when the small plane carrying them on a skydiving outing crashed into a ravine and burst into flames at Bremerton National Airport.

Less than five hours later and 20 miles away across Puget Sound, several people were injured Monday night when the nose gear of an Alaska Airlines jet collapsed after it landed at

Adventures of Shelton, had a male pilot and four skydivers aboard — a woman and three men, Blue Skies spokesman Robert Turso said.

The woman was 22 years old and the men ranged in age from 19 to 57. One person was from Oregon and the rest were from western Washington, said Lt. Gary Leach of the Washington State Patrol.

Witnesses said the plane took

to the airport. Leach said. The plane crashed into a ravine 30 feet to 40 feet deep on the airport grounds and caught fire.

The pilot made no radio calls before the crash, authorities said. The National Transportation Safety Board was to begin its investigation today.

Woman charged in '61 murder returns to Texas for cancer tests

BELLEVILLE — A woman charged with stomping her step-daughter to death in 1961 can return to Texas for cancer tests for the second time in six months.

Mary Rae Morgan, 56, of West Columbia, Texas, is free on bond but must live within 50 miles of Belleville while awaiting trial on first-degree murder charges in the death of 4-year-old Michele LeAnn Morgan in Mascoutah.

The trial is scheduled to start Nov. 17.

Mrs. Morgan has needed periodic medical exams since having breast cancer surgery about five years ago.

She will be allowed to spend four days in Texas this month, St. Clair County Judge Jan Fiss ruled Thursday.

Fiss allowed her to go to Galveston for four days in March, and she returned as promised from that trip.

The judge did not set a date for the trip this month.

Prosecutors accuse Mrs. Morgan of stomping Michele to death Aug. 9, 1961, in their rural Mascoutah farmhouse.

Mrs. Morgan lived there while her husband, Billy Morgan, was stationed at Scott Air Force Base.

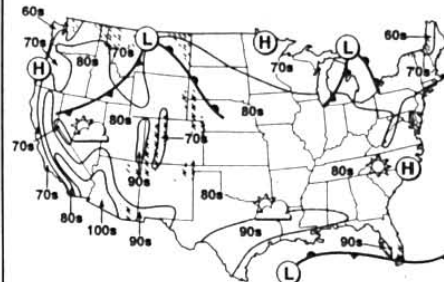

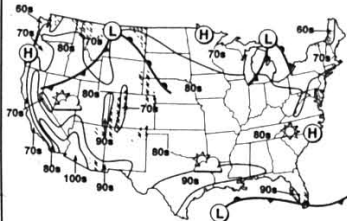

Mom seeking daughter's killer after 5 years

CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa — After five years, Joanne Zywicki still wakes up in the middle of the night, haunted by her daughter's killing.

"A lot of times I wake up thinking about this in one way or another," Zywicki said. "I think about the fact that someone's still out there."

A disabled car belonging to Tammy Zywicki, 21, a Grinnell College senior, was found along Interstate 80 near LaSalle, Ill., on Aug. 23, 1992. Her body was found nine days later wrapped in a blanket along Interstate 44 near Springfield, Mo.

Zywicki bled to death after being stabbed seven times in the chest and once in the right arm. She was driving to Grinnell from her home in Marlton, N.J.

Zywicki has let her daughter's case rest in recent years. She wanted her three sons to get on with their lives and didn't think it was fair to them to focus on Tammy. But now Zywicki wants to go public again with the case in hopes of finding the killer.

Zywicki hopes to present the case on the "Unsolved Mysteries" television show. She was not happy with the early investigation by the Illinois State Police.

When the car was first found abandoned, it took more than 24 hours to enter it into police's central computer.

Zywicki also blames authorities for not immediately making public the description of a truck believed to be involved in the disappearance.

Lt. Pete Gericke of the Illinois State Police said all possibilities were explored.

ISU professor to be Congo ambassador

NORMAL — An Illinois State University professor will take a leave of absence to become United Nations ambassador for Congo. Andre Kapanga, a native of Zaire, has taught foreign languages at the school for four years. Zaire was renamed Congo earlier this year after rebel forces ousted the dictatorship of Mobutu Sese Seko, who died today in Morocco. "It's an honor to serve as ambassador and to help repair all the problems caused by the Mobutu government," he said. "You name it and it's not working. The roads are a mess, the economy is in shambles and health care is so poor you can get sicker when you go to the hospital."

Four hurt on Six Flags roller coaster

GURNEE — A faulty hitch has been blamed for a roller coaster accident at Six Flags Great America amusement park that sent four people to a hospital with minor injuries. A hitch connecting the five cars of the "American Eagle" roller coaster failed Sunday, causing the first two cars to disconnect from the back three, said Fred Friedl, deputy chief of the Gurnee fire department. Two men and two women were treated at St. Therese Medical Center in Waukegan and released. The ride was shut down after the accident and will remain closed until Great America completes its investigation.

Divorcing couple duke it out over cell phone

EDWARDSVILLE — It's not unusual to fight over who gets the kids in a bitter divorce. And it's not all that strange to fight over the house or the dog or the car. But a cellular phone? An Edwardsville couple got into a wrestling match Friday outside a Madison County courtroom over who would get custody of the appliance. Karon Watt was in court seeking an order of protection against her husband, Greg Watt, when his beeper went off. He grabbed his cellular phone to return the call and Karon snatched the phone from his hands and ran out of the courtroom. Greg followed, trying to wrestle the phone from her, when Karon bit his arm. 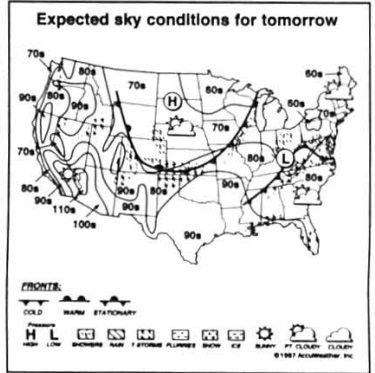

Jack Perkins, owner of Kuttawa Harbor Marina, said the plane is owned by Jim Parsley of Parsley Marine and Aviation Services, which rents space at the Kuttawa Harbor Marina. Mike Wells, spokesman for nearby Moor's Resort, said the plane was making routine excursion flights.

Replica of Christopher Columbus' 'Nina' making its way on Illinois River

BEARDSTOWN — When the hand-built replica of Christopher Columbus' prized sailing ship voyages down the Illinois River to Beardstown on Friday, it will rely on an engine rather than the capricious trans-Atlantic tradewinds.

Not that this copy of the "Nina" can't be sailed. Photographs show its parchment-colored sails puffed like clouds, bow slicing through dark water with sword-like swiftness.

That's in the ocean. Shallow, muddy Midwestern rivers replete with locks and sandbars sometimes require the assistance of an engine — and a savvy local riverboat pilot, explained A.J. Sanger, director of public relations for the Columbus Foundation, a private organization that owns the ship.

"We can go just about anywhere with it," said Sanger by telephone from the foundation's base in the British Virgin Islands.

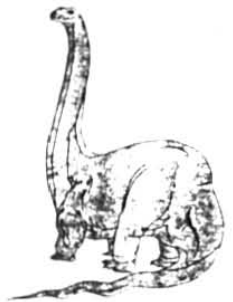

New state law could turn up heat on state's deadbeat parents

CHICAGO — A new state law could put the heat on deadbeat parents, forcing employers to provide information about new workers so they can't skip out on child-support payments.

The law, which goes into effect Oct. 1, creates a state directory of everyone who gets a new job. Supporters hope this will track down parents who evade child-support orders by switching jobs so their salary can't be seized.

"This is going to give the children who deserve support more of it and lessen the burden on taxpayers," said Lt. Gov. Bob Kustra, who headed a tax force earlier this year that helped draft the law.

About 300,000 Illinois employers have begun getting instructions about the new tracking system. The state's welfare agency estimates 220,000 Illinois residents owe a total of \$1.3 billion in overdue child support.

The new system could net \$30 million a year, Kustra's task force estimates.

The law forces employers to submit the name, address and Social Security number of new hires to the Illinois Department of Employment Security within 20 days of employment.

That information will be cross-checked with the state's Department of Public Aid to determine which parents owe money.

The current law permitted workers to be employed for as long as six months before the records were checked.

"Under the old reporting system, a person could change jobs twice a year to avoid detection," Public Aid spokesman Dean Schott said. "But under the new system, that person would have to change jobs 12 times a year, and that becomes purely uneconomic for that person to make that many changes."

Twenty-five other states have adopted similar laws.

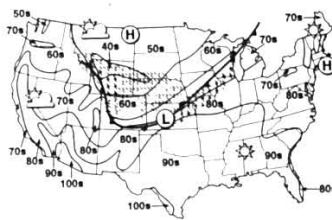

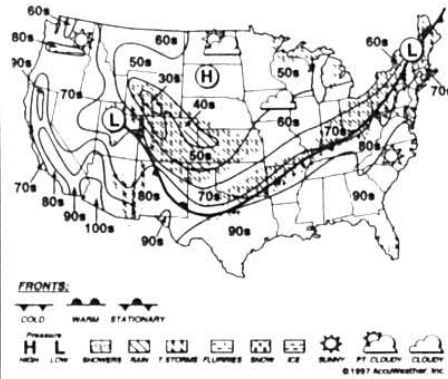

Forecasts now indicate the frost, if any, will not be very harsh.

Wheat futures prices were lower, continuing Thursday's selloff. There is a belief that the U.S. wheat crop will be larger than expected. There is also disappointment in the level of wheat exports.

Improving weather conditions in Australia is expected to boost that nation's wheat crop yield, further pressuring wheat futures prices. Corn futures prices were lower, pressured by the moderate weather forecasts for the weekend. Early harvesting figures from Iowa, which show higher-than-expected per-acre yield, is also pressuring futures.

In early trading, wheat for December delivery was 1 1/2 cents lower at \$3.67 1/2 a bushel; December corn was 1 1/2 cents lower at \$2.63 a bushel; December oats were a 1/4 cent higher at \$1.59 a bushel; November soybeans were 1 1/2 cents higher at \$6.36 1/2 a bushel.

Pork and cattle futures prices were mostly lower in early trading on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

October live cattle were .02 cent higher at 67.92 cents a pound; October feeder cattle were unchanged at 80.50 cents a pound; October lean hogs were .70 cent lower at 70.45 cents a pound; February pork bellies were .87 cents lower at 65.80 cents a pound.

NEW YORK (AP) — The Dow Jones industrial average was down 41.50 to 7,881.22, trading in a narrow range of 20 to 45 points below Thursday's closing level.

Declining issues outnumbered advancers by a thin margin on the New York Stock Exchange, where volume came to 320.04 million shares, well ahead of Thursday's pace.

Broad-market indexes were mostly lower. The Standard & Poor's 500 list was down 0.85 at 946.44.

The NYSE composite index was off 0.43 at 494.98, and the American Stock Exchange composite index was down 1.03 at 685.77.

Only the Nasdaq composite index nosed above Thursday's closing level, up 0.84 at 1,670.86.

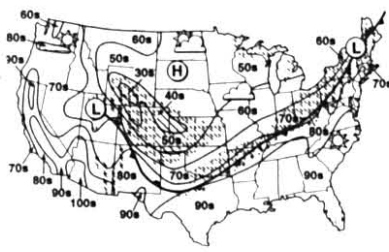

Judge files libel suit against Rockford paper

ROCKFORD — A Circuit judge has sued the Rockford Register Star for more than \$700,000, contending he was libeled by the newspaper's coverage of an investigation of his judicial conduct.

Steven G. Vecchio, an associate Circuit Court judge in Winnebago County, said in his lawsuit Thursday that the Register Star published false statements in September 1996 about his case before the Illinois Judicial Inquiry Board.

The state oversight board accused Vecchio of misusing his position to try to help friends who were in trouble with the law in three separate incidents in 1995. Vecchio has denied the charges and says the news coverage adversely reflected on his integrity and honesty.

The newspaper said it did nothing wrong.

"...the Constitution allows the press to accurately report and editorialize on the conduct of public officials without the fear of being sued," said Thomas D. Luchetti, attorney for the newspaper. "The Register Star con-

ducted itself within the bounds of the First Amendment and will vigorously defend those principles against any attempt to infringe on the freedom of the press."

Vecchio says political opponents referred "certain matters" to the board during his campaign for election as a full Circuit Court judge in November 1995. The board filed a complaint in September 1996 but did not include affidavits or court transcripts containing Vecchio's statements disputing the charges, the lawsuit states.

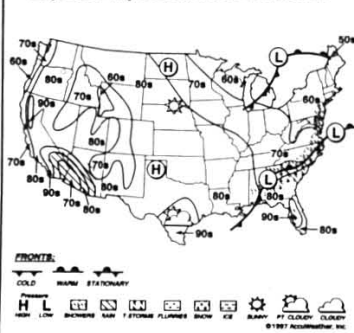

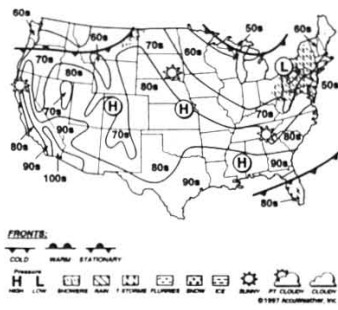
