

# Woman charged in '61 murder returns to Texas for cancer tests



# Mom seeking daughter's killer after 5 years

CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa five years, Joanne Zywicki still wakes up in the middle of the night, haunted by her daughter's

killing.
"A lot of times I wake up thinking about this in one way or another," Zywicki said. "I think about the fact that someone's still out there.'

A disabled car belonging to Tammy Zywicki, 21, a Grinnell College senior, was found along Interstate 80 near LaSalle, Ill., on Aug. 23, 1992. Her body was found nine days later wrapped in a blanket along Interstate 44 near Springfield, Mo.

Zywicki bled to death after being stabbed seven times in the chest and once in the right arm. She was driving to Grinnell from her home in Marlton, N.J.

Zywicki has let her daughter's case rest in recent years. She wanted her three sons to get on with their lives and didn't think the there's and didn't dish it was fair to them to focus on Tammy. But now Zywicki wants to go public again with the case in hopes of finding the killer.

Zywicki hopes to present the case on the "Unsolved Myster-ies" television show. She was not happy with the early investigation by the Illinois State Police.

When the car was first found abandoned, it took more than 24 hours to enter it into police's central computer.

Zywicki also blames authorities for not immediately making public the description of a truck believed to be involved in the disappearance.



BEARDSTOWN - When the hand-built replica of Christopher Columbus' prized sailing ship voyages down the Illinois River to Beardstown on Friday, it will rely on an engine rather than the capricious trans-Atlantic tradewinds.

Not that this copy of the "Nina" can't be sailed. Photographs show its parchmentcolored sails puffed like clouds, bow slicing through dark water with sword-like swiftness.

That's in the ocean. Shallow, muddy Midwestern rivers replete with locks and sandbars sometimes require the assistance of an engine - and a savvy local riverboat pilot, explained A.J. Sanger, director of public relations for the Columbus Foundation, a private organization that owns the ship.

"We can go just about any-where with it," said Sanger by telephone from the foundation's base in the British Virgin Is-



# New state law could turn up heat on state's deadbeat parents

CHICAGO — A new state law could put the heat on deadbeat parents, forcing employers to provide information about new workers so they can't skip

out on child-support payments.

The law, which goes into effect Oct. 1, creates a state directory of everyone who gets a new job. Supporters hope this will track down parents who evade child-support orders by switching jobs so their salary can't be seized.

This is going to give the This is going to give the children who deserve support more of it and lessen the burden on taxpayers," said Lt. Gov. Bob Kustra, who headed a tax force earlier this year that helped draft the law.

neiped draft the law.

About 300,000 Illinois employers have begun getting instructions about the new tracking system. The state's welfare agency estimates 220,000 Illinois residents owe a total of \$1.3 billinois residents. \$1.3 billion in overdue child

The new system could net \$30 million a year, Kustra's task force estimates.

The law forces employers to submit the name, address and Social Security number of new hires to the Illinois Department of Employment Security within 20 days of employment.

That information will be cross-checked with the state's Department of Public Aid to determine which parents owe

money.

The current law permitted workers to be employed for as long as six months before the

records were checked.
"Under the old reporting system, a person could change jobs twice a year to avoid detection," Public Aid spokesman Dean Public Aid spokesman Dean Schott said. "But under the new system, that person would have to change jobs 12 times a year, and that becomes purely uneconomic for that person to make that many changes."
Twenty-five other states have

adopted similar laws.

# Assessment on third airport yields new population outlook

CHICAGO - Harvest time is coming to the cornfields of eastern Will County and some state officials are hoping to reap a major new airport

The cornfields near Peotone will compete with an exploding crop of people if the proposed South Suburban Airport is built, according to a draft of an environmental assessment commissioned by the state.

The assessment was prepared in consultation with the Federal Aviation Administration and the final version probably will be sent to that federal agency this December

The FAA may do additional studies or just use the assessment when issuing its own Environmental Impact Statement, probably by the end of next vear.

The state should also know within a year whether any airlines are interested in locating at the site and how much, if any, private investment they can expect, said Robert York, who is heading up the airport study for the state Department of Transportation.

"I think about this time next year we will be in a position to know if it is possible or not possible to build the airport,' said York.

"At that point, it becomes a political decision," he said.

The assessment, prepared by TAMS Consultants, projects a 94 percent increase in population in the 14 townships surrounding the proposed airport by 2020, as opposed to a 25 percent increase if the airport is not

There would be 26 percent growth in a nine-county Chicago area with the airport, compared to a 17 percent increase without the airport, according to the assessment.

The counties include Cook, Will, Kane, DuPage, Lake, McHenry, and Kankakee counties in Illinois and Lake and PorThe numbers seem to be at odds with population and employment forecasts done by the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission.

ter counties in Indiana.

The numbers seem to be at odds with population and employment forecasts done by the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission. A NIPC report concluded that the population increase in a six-county Chicago region (not including Kankakee County or the Indiana counties) would be about 25 percent whether or not the airport is built.

The airport would generate an additional 236,000 jobs, \$5.1 billion in annual salaries, \$3.4 billion in increased visitor spending, and have no effect on O'Hare International and Midway airports, according to the assessment. The NIPC report, however, said a new south suburban airport would only add about 150 jobs to the area by the year 2020.

The problem with the NIPC figures is that they assume O'Hare can handle the increase in airport traffic being projected for the area, said York. "O'Hare cannot handle it," he said.

York said Chicago has claimed for the last three years that it can handle the demand. but has not provided any documentation to prove it.

According to York, another study done by NIPC and the University of Illinois found that there would be 525,000 fewer jobs by 2020 in a 14-county area around Chicago if the airport is not built.
