Judge orders Jackson, racist to stay away from Decatur school grounds

DECATUR — The Rev. Jesse Jackson and white supremacist Must Hale are among those banned from demonstrating on or near school grounds in Decatur,

Macon County Circuit Court Judge James Hendrian issued a pre-liminary injunction Thursday in response to last month's protests over students expelled for lighting at a Sept. 17 football game.

Jackson and supporters of his Rainbow/PUSH Coalition opposed the expulsions. Hale supported the school district, which later allowed the expelled students to entroll in alternative school.

The school district initially filed a lawsuit in mid-November to pre-vent Jackson, his top aides, the expelled students or their parents from "engaging in any activities which would substantially disrupt the district's daily operations."

The district shut down its high schools for two days as Jackson led protests against the expulsions.

School district attorneys added Hate to the list after he and a handful of his supporters started staging their own small raffice outside the schools to support the expulsions.

"Essentially, the school board is so anxious to prove that it is not racially biased that it has wrongful-




